Attending Note:

Mateusz Fijalkowski is a 22 y.o. male BIBA from pool, who presents with drowning today. Initially, call came for Police since pt was a Lifeguard swimming and pacing back and forth talking to himself in Polish, and not listening to other Lifeguard members. Police report that pt would dive into the pool, hold his breath under water, and resurface, a couple times. A polish Police officer arrived and reported that the pt was praying in Polish. Police state that pt entered the shallow end of the pool, walked to the deep end, and did not come up for air. Police dove in to pull pt out, stating that he might have been under water for ~30-60 seconds. Police began CPR, and EMS arrived 5 minutes after. Pt given Ketamine and Versed, and resuscitated. After resuscitation, EMS states that pt was agitated and mumbling, before going into V-fib. EMS shocked, pt in PEA, shocked again, went back into V-fib, shocked, and went into sinus tach. Pt intubated by EMS prior to ED arrival. Police denies trauma or injury.
